



LVN to RN Transition Program ADVISORY PACKET-26SP

The LVN to RN Transition Program will hold information sessions prior to each application period. Dates will be listed on the TSTC website. These sessions will provide information on the application process and requirements for entrance to the LVN to RN Transition Program.

The LVN to RN Transition Program will prepare students with the basic competencies to become safe practitioners in the healthcare field. Upon successful completion of the Associate of Applied Science major in Associate Degree Nursing, the graduate will be able to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). After successful completion of this exam, the individual will be a registered nurse and can work in hospitals, day-surgery centers, rehabilitation centers, physicians' offices, and home health care agencies, among other areas.

The LVN to RN Transition Program is a highly selective program. The selection process is based on a competitive point system. Selection criteria are used to assess the applicant's score. Please refer to <https://www.tstc.edu/programs/nursing> for the information session dates, TEAS 7.0 pre-entrance testing information, and other deadlines.

This program is a HYBRID program which means the program combines elements of online learning and in-person instruction. Skills, simulation lab, and clinical experiences are face-to-face, while 'classroom' work is online.

An application link will be given to you after attending a mandatory information session. Information sessions are conducted via Google Meet or in-person (depending on campus).

APPLICATION / ADMISSION PROCESS:

Requirements for application to the LVN to RN Transition Program

1. Must be an LVN. License should be current, active, and in good standing and should be kept current for the duration of the program.
2. Apply for admission to TSTC and meet all college requirements. TSTC maintains an open admission policy. Admission to the college does not guarantee admission to all programs.
 - a. Submit an official copy of your high school transcript and all transcripts from other colleges.
 - b. Apply for financial aid.
3. Attend a mandatory information session.
 - a. Link to LVN to RN Transition Program application will be provided after attending the session.
4. Must take the following pre-entrance exam:

a. ATI TEAS 7 Exam

i. **Required scores:**

1. Composite score: 70%
2. Reading score: 75%

ii. Required scores must be made on the same exam attempt. If required scores are not met, the test may be taken again for a higher score. The exam can be taken up to three times in a testing period. **Submit proof of the higher score.**

iii. There are study guides available for the ATI TEAS 7 exam to help prepare for the exam.

b. All pre-entrance exam scores will be valid for one year for application purposes.

5. Complete online application for the LVN to RN Transition Program.

a. All required copies of documents must be submitted with the application.

3. BIOL 2420: Microbiology for Non-Science Majors (or BIOL 2320 Micro lecture and BIOL 2120 Micro lab)**
4. ENGL 1301: Composition I
5. PSYC 2301: General Psychology
6. PSYC 2314: Lifespan Growth and Development
7. ACGM X3XX: Humanities or Fine Arts elective (see list below)

****Science courses cannot be older than 10 years****

If A&P I or II are older than 10 years:

An LVN that is currently working with direct patient care, and has been for a minimum of 5 years, is eligible to test out of the A&P time limit restrictions.

The student may register and take the HESI A&P exam and must make at least an 850. This exam can only be taken ONCE per application period.

- If this score is MET, the student will **not** have to retake the expired A&P courses.
- If this score is NOT met, the student **will** need to retake the A&P courses that are expired or wait to retake the HESI A&P exam in the next application period.
- This must be completed prior to the application period due date. Score must be submitted with the application.

SELECTION PROCESS:

The selection process is based on a competitive point system evaluation. Selection criteria are used to assess the applicant's score. Points are given for the following criteria:

NOTIFICATION OF APPLICATION STATUS:

Applicants must have submitted all required application documents. All scores will be added and students with the highest points will be accepted into the program based upon the number of available spots in the cohort. Decisions are ultimately made by the LVN to RN Transition Program Admissions Committee and confirmed by the Program Team Lead and may not be appealed. Students not admitted are free to reapply in the following application enrollment period.

A letter will be sent to the student indicating acceptance, contingent acceptance, alternate list, or non-acceptance. All students except those that are not accepted will be required to attend a mandatory orientation.

Should any of the accepted applicants decline admission, an alternate will be offered a spot in the program. Alternates are selected from the next highest scores in the pool of qualified applicants.

Any applicants that are not accepted may schedule a meeting with the Enrollment Coach or Program Team Lead for further consultation.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS:

Students who have accepted a position in the LVN to RN Transition Program will have their names submitted to the Texas Board of Nursing for clearance into the program. A blue card, letter of clearance, or a letter of denial will be sent directly to the student from the Board which must be turned in to the Program Team Lead or program secretary.

The student may be required to complete fingerprint clearance and criminal history check for the Texas Board of Nursing. Students will be notified by the Texas Board of Nursing directly. Registered nurse license eligibility is determined through a DPS/FBI criminal history background check completed through the Texas Board of Nursing. Information relating to the criminal history and declaratory order (DO) process is available on the Texas Board of Nursing website: http://www.bon.texas.gov/licensure_eligibility.asp

It is highly recommended to initiate the DO process at the time of your application if there is anything in your background that may show up as a criminal offense in the background check, even if adjudicated or expunged and it happened many years ago.

DRUG SCREENS:

Drug screening is arranged through the nursing program and will be completed prior to the start of clinical rotations. The program can request initial, random, and for-cause drug screening. The cost for drug screening will be the responsibility of the student.

REQUIRED INSURANCE:

Health science students should be aware that many of the facilities where they will receive clinical training require each student to be covered by various forms of insurance. TSTC may request proof of coverage prior to enrollment or prior to placement at a clinical site, and clinical site personnel may ask for proof of coverage at any time. Students may be denied access to clinical experience if not covered by the required insurance.

Failure of students to obtain required insurance will prevent students from attending some facilities which may prevent students from completing the program or cause them to fail the program.
