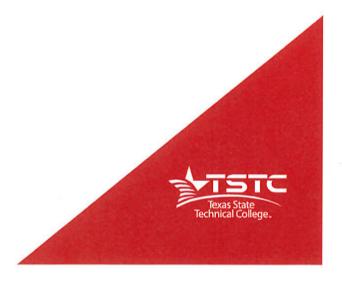

Background: The Texas State Technical College (TSTC) Board of Regents (Board) is

authorized to set tuition and fees in accordance with statutory provisions. TSTC sets tuition rates a full year in advance of the effective term to precede the upcoming sales cycle. TSTC's tuition pricing structure supports a market-driven approach by segmenting the pricing for instructional

programs into a tiered pricing framework. Factors such as student demand,

demand and wage trends for graduates, and the financial profile of programs are considered when segmenting programs within the pricing tiers. TSTC's program vitality process also guides the determination of pricing tiers for programs. Pricing tier determinations occur annually.

Subscription-based tuition pricing represents a singular fee paid by students per term that allows the student the opportunity to accelerate through the degree plan by taking additional courses at no incremental cost

to the student.

Subscription-based tuition pricing applies to Performance-Based Education (PBE) programs only. The College had planned to launch the PBE modality for two instructional programs in Fall 2020; however, the COVID-19 response planning diverted resources from the PBE project and

implementation will be postponed to Fall 2021.

TSTC administration recommends the attached Schedule of Tuition and

Fees Effective Fall 2021 Semester. The schedule includes an increase across the designated tuition tiers, ranging from 2% to 9% to align pricing with demand and to appropriately recover costs of instructional delivery.

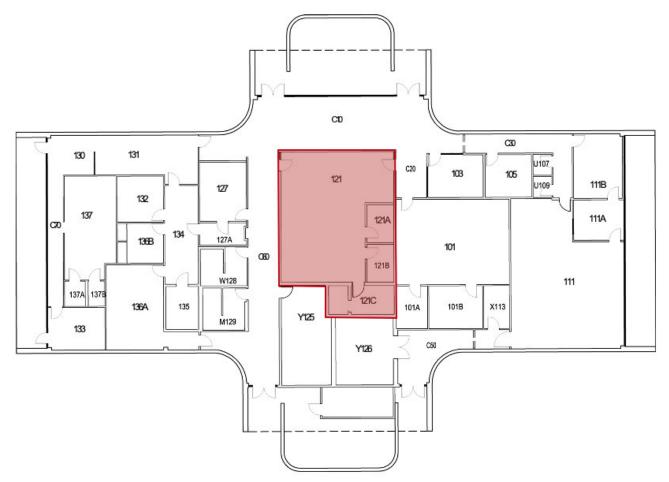

Because the LRGVDC is a political subdivision of the State of Texas, organized pursuant to Chapter 391 of the Texas Local Government Code, the indemnities and insurance requirements that we would ordinarily put in place are not applicable, and are not included within the agreement.

Having reviewed the agreement in question and the Texas Education Code it is my opinion that the delegation of authority from the Board of Regents to the Chancellor, or his designee, to enter into and execute all necessary documents for the lease of classroom space to the Lower Rio Grande Valley Development Corporation at Texas State Technical College in Harlingen, comports with state law and TSTC policy.

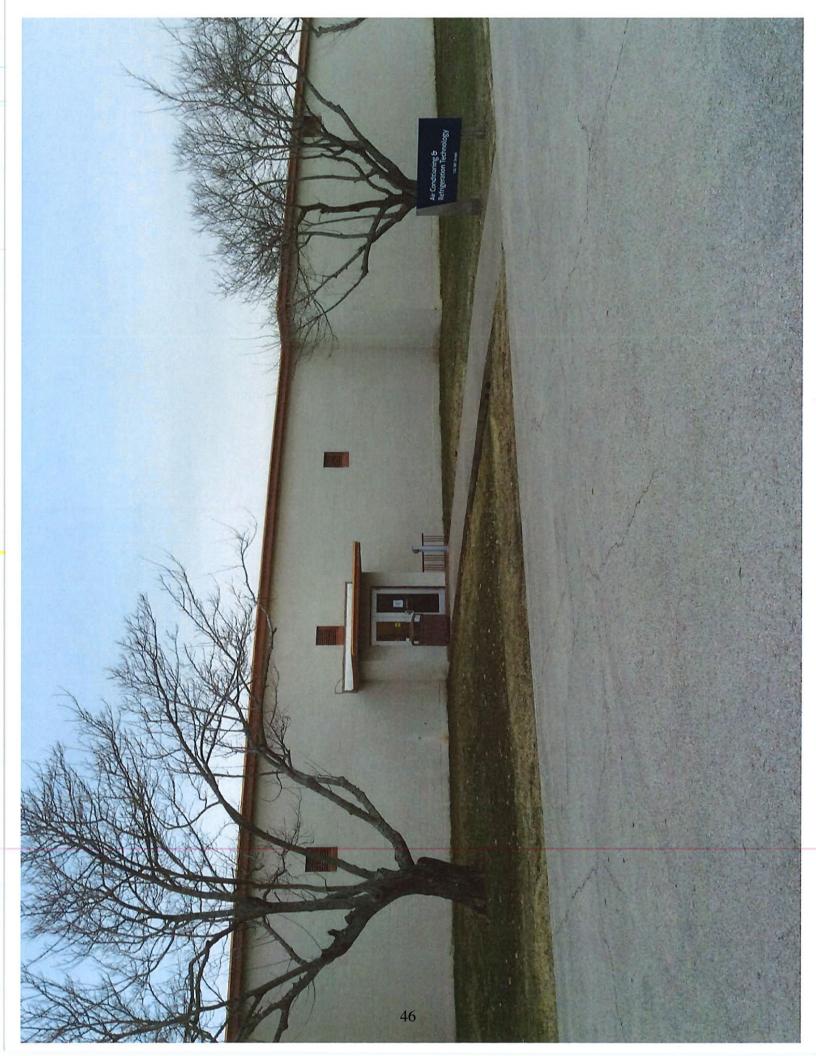

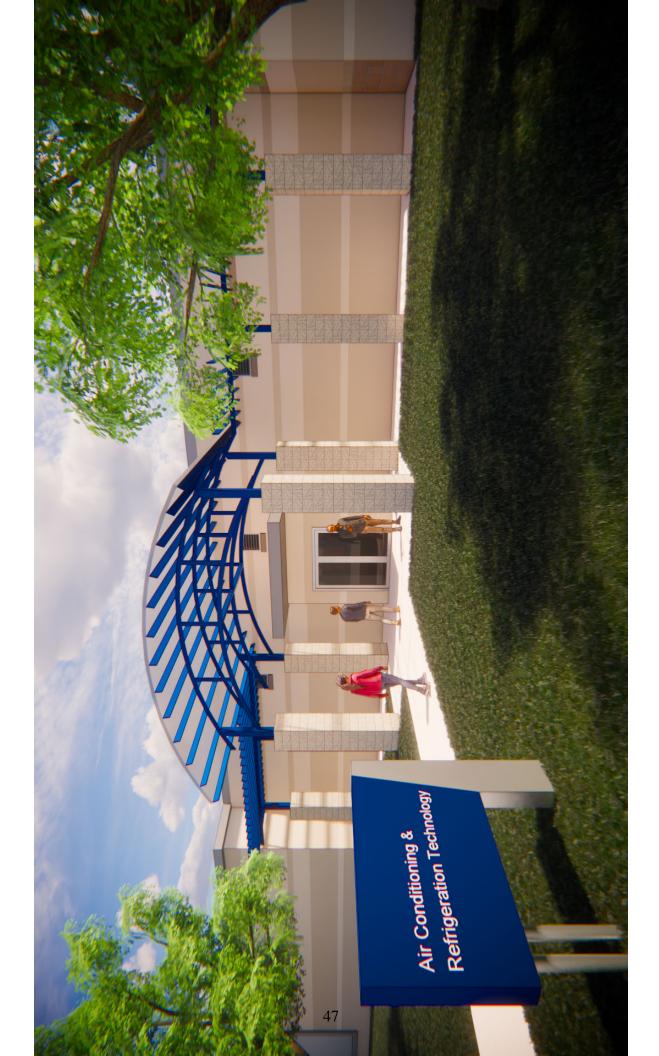
