Subject: Approve Schedule of Tuition and Fees Effective Fall 2023 Semester

Background: The Texas State Technical College (TSTC) Board of Regents (Board) is authorized to

set tuition and fees in accordance with statutory provisions. TSTC sets tuition rates a full year in advance of the effective term to precede the upcoming sales cycle. TSTC's tuition pricing structure supports a market-driven approach by segmenting the pricing for instructional programs into a tiered pricing framework. Factors such as student demand, demand and wage trends for graduates, and the financial profile of programs are considered when segmenting programs within the pricing tiers. TSTC's program vitality process also guides the determination of

pricing tiers for programs. Pricing tier determinations occur annually.

Subscription-based tuition pricing represents a singular fee paid by students per term that allows the student the opportunity to accelerate through the degree plan by taking additional courses at no incremental cost to the student.

Subscription-based tuition pricing applies to Performance-Based Education (PBE)

programs only.

Justification: TSTC administration recommends the attached Schedule of Tuition and Fees

Effective Fall 2023 Semester. The schedule includes an increase across the designated tuition tiers at 5% to align pricing with demand, account for inflation,

and to appropriately recover costs of instructional delivery.

Fiscal Implications: TSTC anticipates revenue will increase as a result of the tuition rate proposal.

Subject: Approve Schedule of Student and Family Housing Rental Rates, Room and

Board Rates, Service Charges, and Deposits, Effective Fall 2023 Semester

Background: Management proposes increasing student housing rates at Texas State

Technical College in certain residential facilities, according to the included Schedule of Student and Family Housing Rental Rates, Service Charges, and Deposits Effective Fall 2023 Semester. The proposed rates keep the individual properties aligned with comparable properties, in the communities in which they are located, while continuing to provide students reasonable affordability, access to campus and support services fostering student engagement and success. This will also support needed upkeep and renovation on all residences and increase

the efficacy of Housing to benefit the students.

Justification: The following factors support the proposal to raise student housing and meal

rates.

 Raising rates in Marshall's 2-bedroom apartment option will create more disparity between the 4-bedroom and 2-bedroom rental rates, helping to identify the 2-bedroom option as a premium option. This will also more closely align the 2-bedroom rental rates with off-campus, market competitive properties while still remaining at a reasonable rate for students.

- Raising the rates in Sweetwater's Wasp, Rolling Plains and Avenger Apartments create more disparity between the Apartment and Lodge offerings, properly positioning the pricing due to available full kitchens and shared common areas.

Construction Assistance Projects and the Additional Capital Improvement Projects, which are more generally described as financing costs to acquire, purchase, construct, improve, renovate, enlarge, and equip property and facilities, including roads and related infrastructure, at various campuses and facilities of

the System;

Information: related approvals, authorizations and delegations.

Fiscal Implications: Assuming 100% of the bonds are issued, TSTC will incur maximum future annual

debt service payments totaling \$25.4 million, \$14.5 million of which will be funded by state appropriations. The remaining \$10.9 million of "local" debt

service will be funded by tuition and operational revenues.

Generally, Chapters <u>51</u> and <u>135</u> of the Texas Education Code vest the organization and control of TSTC with the Board of Regents, and this would specifically include leasing land and permanent improvements owned by the system as the Board determines is in the best interest of fulfilling the mission of the system.

The land and facilities to be leased at the TSTC Waco Airport to Air Methods Corporation is surplus and not needed, nor anticipated to be needed in the foreseeable future, by TSTC for instruction or training. The applicable indemnities and insurance requirements will be included in the lease.

Having reviewed the Texas Education Code, it is my opinion that (1) the approval of the lease of land and facilities to Air Methods, and (2) the delegation of authority from the Board of Regents to the Chancellor, or his designee, to negotiate the lease of said land and facilities, entering into and executing all necessary documents to complete said lease comports with state law and TSTC policy.

Notes:

Explanations are provided below for any notable variances from the orignal budget.

- 1) Tuition revenue is currently forecasted to exceed budget by approximately \$8.8 million in FY 22. The original budget of \$44 million was conservative, as uncertainties around the pandemic still had the potential for disruption when the budget was approved in August 2021. Enrollment has rebounded to pre-pandemic levels, and pricing changes in certain programs have contributed to the increased revenue now that enrollment has stabilized.
- 2) Student Financial Aid revenue, as well as Student Financial Aid Expense, are both significantly higher than budgeted due to the infusion of CARES student grants. TSTC has awarded over \$12 million CARES student grants this fiscal year to date. These funds have a net zero impact on the operating budget as the revenue offsets the expense.
- **3)** Other/supplemental revenue sources including Auxiliary Enterprises and Industry Relations have seen relative growth in FY 22 (compared to pandemic lows) as enrollment has stabilized. Forecasts for these revenues remain less than budget due to the pandemic surge in the previous Fall semester that muted these revenues significantly.
- **4)** Grant revenue, as well as grant expense, are both significantly higher than budget as execution of CARES Institutional grant projects is now in full swing. This variance was expected, and the majority of this grant activity has a net zero effect on the operating margin. National supply chain issues continue to make the timing of expenditures unpredictable, but increased activity in these accounts reflects progress.
- **5)** As noted in the final FY 2021 Operating Budget Performance report, TSTC recognized \$5.9 million of CARES grant "lost revenue" in that period to be used at a later date. As those funds are expended in the months and years ahead, a carryforward amount will be added to this line item to offset those costs and appropriately match revenues and expenses in the same period. Further, as TSTC uses reserves, to pay off debt for example, this line may be populated to offset the increased expense in the current fiscal year.
- **6)** Expenditures in the primary operating divisions of the College are tracking appropriately, with most in the 75% 85% range of budget utilized after three fiscal quarters. Expenses in Information Technology have been elevated this fiscal year as a result of the Workday implementation. Forecasted annual expenditures for most of these divisions are over the original budget, as planned. Utilization of the "Strategic Pool" budget throughout the fiscal year increases budgets in operating divisions while reducing the pool amount, which causes no net increase to the budget as a whole. A majority of the expenditures funded from the strategic pool have been utilized for faculty and staff pay raises, along with new positions added to meet the increased enrollment demand.
- 7) At the March 2022 Board of Regents meeting, a budget increase of \$5.5 million was approved to pay off various outstanding long term debts. This increase is reflected in the forecast for Debt Service & Leases expenditures. The last of these debt will be paid off in August 2022.

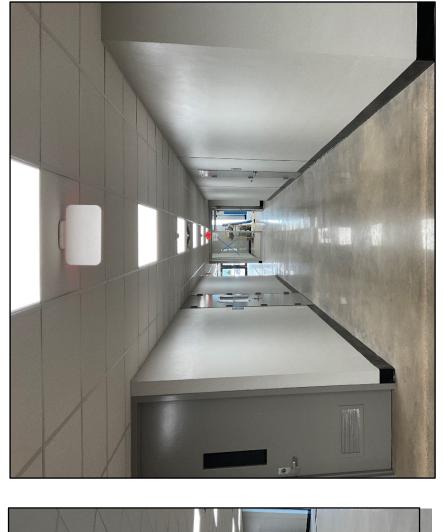

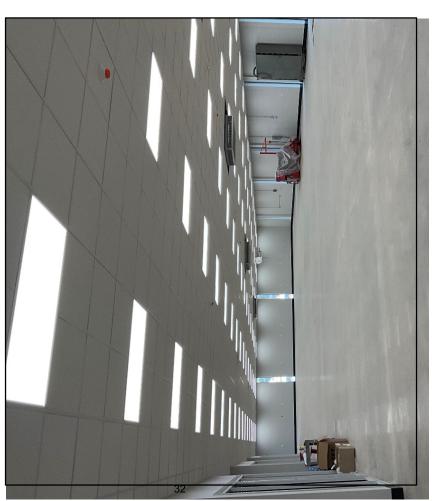
