The accounting department has announced that more assets have been identified as missing than last year. He explained that Workday has affected the process as it creates a transition from a manual process to an automated process. The Chancellor provided additional information. Mallory projects for this project to be completed in a few months.

Mallory brought to attention the Audit Status Schedules for Fiscal Years 2022 and 2023 and the Internal Audit Annual Report. He also provided further information regarding the rest of the Audit reports. Mallory pointed out that the Chancellor reminds and encourages the staff to participate in the attestation disclosure process.

The Chancellor commented that the West Waco ITC project will be included with these audits.

Chairman asked what the projection is for enrollment costs for 2023. Wooten answered with assurance.

Chancellor Reeser explained the purpose of the pledged collateral report. Regent Widup asked about the remainder of CARES fund and the exposure on the funds. Wooten offered reassurance that the funds are being audited and explained that all student funds have been disbursed. Wooten gave kudos to the Office of Sponsored Programs and Grants.

Wooten reviewed the Quarterly Investment Report. He pointed out that all debt has been paid and the payroll funds have increased. He also highlighted the total bond proceeds and how it will look different next year.

Wooten explained the Debt Service Report and acknowledged the decrease. Wooten continued to provide explanation of the report.

Wooten informed the regents of the Total Outstanding Debt as of August 31, 2022.

Wooten explained the outlook from Fitch. Moody's label as negative due to the extreme amount of debt. He provided reassurances that there is no need for concern.

Chairman Cleveland asked, "How many bond rating agencies are there?" Wooten answered with three agencies. VC Hoekstra added commentary regarding TSTC's plan to be bold.

In principle, the WIF will exchange land with TSTC for the project and the City and County will provide funds for construction of a workforce training facility. TSTC will provide monetary and in-kind contributions for equipment and ongoing

operations.

Under the concept, TSTC will operate the Center and focus the training provided on the most urgent and important workforce needs of Waco area industrial employers. Explanations are provided below for any notable variances from the original budget.

- 1) Actual tuition revenue for the Fall and Spring semesters did not meet the 5% growth expectations of the revenue budget, resulting in a forecast of approximately \$52.5 million for the year, which is nearly identical to actual tuition revenue in FY 2022.
- **2)** Rising interest rates are providing a favorable variance from budget for interest income. Further, interest income from bond proceeds will provide funding to cover interim debt service payments on the recently issued 2022A bonds.
- **3)** TSTC routinely utilizes accumulated reserves for various purposes. In FY 2023, \$4.9 million of reserves is budgeted to supplement current year revenues, and offset some one-time costs in the annual budget, such as aircraft purchases of approximately \$1.8 million. Also, revenue from the CARES grant recognized in prior years will be included in this line item as it deployed over time.
- **4)** Forecasted actual expenditures in the primary operating divisions of the College mostly exceed the original budget, as planned. Utilization of the "Strategic Pool" budget throughout the fiscal year increases budgets in operating divisions while reducing the pool amount, which causes no net increase to the budget as a whole.
- **5)** Actual expenses in Information Technology are elevated in the first quarter, as one-time annual expenditures are made at the beginning of the fiscal year for annual software subscriptions and services. Further, ongoing investments in the multi-year Workday implementation project are reflected in this line item as well.
- **6)** Much of the annual debt service of the College is disbursed in the first quarter each fiscal year, as planned. Also, as mentioned in note #2, significant interest income from bond proceeds will be recognized in the current year, which will offset an increase in debt service expenditures in February 2023, as initial payments come due on the recently issued 2022A (CCAP) bonds.
- **7)** A majority of the Strategic Pool budget has been deployed for FY 2023. \$7.75 million of the total is allocated to fund TSTC's *Pay for Performance* merit program, as well as new positions. Other deployments include investments in expansion projects (including the new FAME and Waco Annex locations), software upgrades, and supplements to budgets in Instruction and External Relations to relieve inflationary pressure.







However, included in the changes to the aforementioned Codes are provisions that permit the TSTC Board of Regents to delegate said approval and signatory authority to the Chancellor or his designee.


